

## PAUL'S PRAYERS

### 1 Thessalonians

1:<sup>2</sup>We give thanks to God always for all of you,  
making mention *of you* in our prayers;

<sup>3</sup>constantly bearing in mind your work of faith  
and labor of love  
and steadfastness of hope  
in our Lord Jesus Christ  
in the presence of our God and Father,

3:<sup>10</sup>as we night and day keep praying most earnestly that we may see your face,  
and may complete what is lacking in your faith

11Now may our God and Father Himself and Jesus our Lord direct our way to you;

12and may the Lord cause you to increase and abound in love for one another,  
and for all people,

just as we also *do* for you;

<sup>13</sup>so that He may establish your hearts without blame in holiness  
before our God and Father  
at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all His saints.

### 2 Thessalonians

1:<sup>3</sup>We ought always to give thanks to God for you, brethren, as is *only* fitting,  
because your faith is greatly enlarged,  
and the love of each one of you toward one another grows *ever* greater;

11To this end also we pray for you always,  
that our God will count you worthy of your calling,  
and fulfill every desire for goodness

and the work of faith with power,

<sup>12</sup>so that the name of our Lord Jesus will be glorified in you,  
and you in Him,  
according to the grace of our God and *the* Lord Jesus Christ.

2:<sup>16</sup>Now may our Lord Jesus Christ Himself and God our Father,  
who has loved us

and given us eternal comfort  
and good hope by grace,

<sup>17</sup>comfort  
and strengthen your hearts in every good work and word.

3:<sup>1</sup>Finally, brethren, pray for us

that the word of the Lord will spread rapidly and be glorified,  
just as *it did* also with you;

<sup>2</sup>and that we will be rescued from perverse and evil men; for not all have faith.

<sup>5</sup>May the Lord direct your hearts into the love of God  
and into the steadfastness of Christ.

<sup>16</sup>Now may the Lord of peace Himself continually grant you peace in every circumstance.

The Lord be with you all!

## Romans 1:8-12

<sup>8</sup>First, I thank my God  
    through Jesus Christ  
    for you all,  
        because your faith  
            is being proclaimed throughout the whole world.

<sup>9</sup>For God,  
    whom I serve  
        in my spirit  
        in the *preaching of the gospel* of His Son,  
    is my witness  
        as to how unceasingly I make mention of you,  
            <sup>10</sup>always in my prayers making request,

if perhaps now at last by the will of God  
    I may succeed in coming to you.

<sup>11</sup>For I long to see you  
    so that I may impart some spiritual gift to you,  
        that you may be established;  
<sup>12</sup>that is, that I may be encouraged  
        together with you *while* among you,  
            each of us by the other's faith,  
                both yours and mine.

## Romans 15:30-33

<sup>30</sup>Now I urge you, brethren,  
    by our Lord Jesus Christ  
and by the love of the Spirit,  
  
to strive together with me  
    in your prayers to God for me,  
        <sup>31</sup>that I may be rescued  
                from those who are disobedient in Judea,  
        and *that* my service for Jerusalem may prove acceptable to the saints;  
        <sup>32</sup>so that I may come to you in joy by the will of God  
                and find *refreshing* rest in your company.

<sup>33</sup>Now the God of peace be with you all. Amen.

## 1 Corinthians 1:4-9

<sup>4</sup>I thank my God always concerning you for the grace of God which was given you in Christ Jesus,  
<sup>5</sup>that in everything you were enriched in Him, in all speech and all knowledge,  
<sup>6</sup>even as the testimony concerning Christ was confirmed in you,  
    <sup>7</sup>so that you are not lacking in any gift, awaiting eagerly the revelation of our Lord Jesus Christ,  
        <sup>8</sup>who will also confirm you to the end, blameless  
            in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ.  
<sup>9</sup>God is faithful, through whom you were called into fellowship with His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

## 2 Corinthians 1:8-11

<sup>8</sup>For we do not want you to be unaware, brethren, of our affliction which came *to us* in Asia, that we were burdened excessively, beyond our strength, so that we despaired even of life;  
    <sup>9</sup>indeed, we had the sentence of death within ourselves so that we would not trust in ourselves, but in God who raises the dead;  
    <sup>10</sup>who delivered us from so great a *peril of death*, and will deliver us,  
        He on whom we have set our hope.  
And He will yet deliver us,  
<sup>11</sup>you also joining in helping us through your prayers, so that thanks may be given by many persons on our behalf for the favor bestowed on us through *the prayers of many*.

## Ephesians 1:15-23

<sup>15</sup>For this reason I too,  
having heard of the faith in the Lord Jesus which *exists* among you  
and your love for all the saints,

<sup>16</sup>do not cease giving thanks for you,  
while making mention *of you* in my prayers;

<sup>17</sup>that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory,  
may give to you a spirit of wisdom  
and of revelation in the knowledge of Him.

<sup>18</sup>*I pray that* the eyes of your heart may be enlightened,  
so that you will know what is the hope of His calling,  
what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints,

<sup>19</sup>and what is the surpassing greatness of His power toward us who believe.  
*These are* in accordance with the working of the strength of His might

<sup>20</sup>which He brought about in Christ,  
when He raised Him from the dead  
and seated Him at His right hand  
in the heavenly *places*,

<sup>21</sup>far above all rule and authority and power  
and dominion,  
and every name that is named,  
not only in this age but also in the one to come.

<sup>22</sup>And He put all things in subjection under His feet,  
and gave Him as head over all things  
to the church,<sup>2</sup>

<sup>3</sup>which is His body,  
the fullness of Him  
who fills all in all.

## Ephesians 3:14-21

<sup>14</sup>For this reason I bow my knees before the Father,  
<sup>5</sup>from whom every family in heaven and on earth  
derives its name,

<sup>16</sup>that He would grant you,  
according to the riches of His glory,  
to be strengthened with power through His Spirit in the inner man,

<sup>17</sup>so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith;  
*and* that you,  
being rooted and grounded in love,  
may be able to comprehend with all the saints  
what is the breadth and length and height and depth,  
<sup>19</sup>and to know the love of Christ  
which surpasses knowledge,  
that you may be filled up to all the fullness of God.

<sup>20</sup>Now to Him who is able to do far more abundantly beyond all that we ask or think,  
according to the power that works within us,

<sup>21</sup>to Him *be* the glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations forever and ever. Amen.

## Philippians 1:3-5

<sup>3</sup>I thank my God  
    in all my remembrance of you,  
<sup>4</sup>always offering prayer  
        with joy  
    in my every prayer  
        for you all,  
<sup>5</sup>in view of your participation in the gospel  
        from the first day until now.

## Philippians 1:9-11

<sup>9</sup>And this I pray,  
    that your love may abound  
        still more and more  
        in real knowledge  
    and all discernment,  
        <sup>10</sup>so that you may approve  
            the things that are excellent,  
    in order to be sincere  
        and blameless  
            until the day of Christ;  
<sup>11</sup>having been filled with the fruit of righteousness  
        which *comes* through Jesus Christ,  
    to the glory  
        and praise of God.

## Philippians 1:19-20

<sup>19</sup>for I know that this will turn out for my deliverance  
    through your prayers  
        and the provision of the Spirit of Jesus Christ,

<sup>20</sup>according to my earnest expectation and hope,  
    that I will not be put to shame in anything,  
    but *that* with all boldness,  
        Christ will even now,  
            as always,  
        be exalted in my body,  
            whether by life  
                or by death.

## Colossians 1:3-14

<sup>3</sup>We give thanks to God,  
the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,  
praying always for you,  
<sup>4</sup>since we heard of your faith in Christ Jesus  
and the love which you have for all the saints;  
<sup>5</sup>because of the hope laid up for you in heaven,  
of which you previously heard in the word of truth,  
the gospel <sup>6</sup>which has come to you,  
just as in all the world also it is constantly bearing fruit  
and increasing,  
even as *it has been doing* in you also  
since the day you heard *of it*  
and understood the grace of God in truth;  
<sup>7</sup>just as you learned *it* from Epaphras,  
our beloved fellow bond-servant,  
who is a faithful servant of Christ on our behalf,  
<sup>8</sup>and he also informed us of your love in the Spirit.

<sup>9</sup>For this reason also,  
since the day we heard *of it*,  
we have not ceased to pray for you  
and to ask that you may be filled with the knowledge of His will  
in all spiritual wisdom and understanding,  
<sup>10</sup>so that you will walk in a manner worthy of the Lord,  
to please *Him* in all respects,  
bearing fruit in every good work  
and increasing in the knowledge of God;

<sup>11</sup>strengthened with all power,  
according to His glorious might,  
for the attaining of all steadfastness  
and patience;  
joyously <sup>12</sup>giving thanks to the Father,  
who has qualified us  
to share in the inheritance of the saints in Light.

<sup>13</sup>For He rescued us from the domain of darkness,  
and transferred us to the kingdom  
of His beloved Son,  
<sup>14</sup>in whom we have redemption,  
the forgiveness of sins.

## 1 Timothy 2:1-4

<sup>1</sup>First of all, then, I urge that entreaties  
and prayers,  
petitions  
and thanksgivings,  
be made on behalf of all men,  
  
<sup>2</sup>for kings  
and all who are in authority,  
  
so that we may lead a tranquil  
and quiet life  
in all godliness  
and dignity.  
  
<sup>3</sup>This is good and acceptable  
in the sight of God our Savior,  
<sup>4</sup>who desires all men to be saved  
and to come to the knowledge of the truth.

## 2 Timothy 1:3-4

<sup>3</sup>I thank God,  
whom I serve with a clear conscience  
the way my forefathers did,  
as I constantly remember you  
in my prayers  
night and day,  
  
<sup>4</sup>longing to see you,  
even as I recall your tears,  
so that I may be filled with joy.

## Hebrews 13:18-19

<sup>18</sup>Pray for us,  
for we are sure that we have a good conscience,  
desiring to conduct ourselves honorably  
in all things.  
<sup>19</sup>And I urge *you* all the more to do this,  
so that I may be restored to you the sooner.

## **Hebrews 13:20-21**

<sup>20</sup>Now the God of peace,  
    who brought up from the dead  
        the great Shepherd of the sheep  
            through the blood of the eternal covenant,  
                *even Jesus our Lord,*  
<sup>21</sup>equip you in every good thing to do His will,  
    working in us that which is pleasing in His sight,  
        through Jesus Christ,  
            to whom *be* the glory forever and ever. Amen.

## **Philemon 4-7**

<sup>4</sup>I thank my God always,  
    making mention of you in my prayers,  
<sup>5</sup>because I hear of your love  
    and of the faith  
        which you have toward the Lord Jesus  
            and toward all the saints;  
<sup>6</sup>*and I pray* that the fellowship of your faith may become effective  
        through the knowledge of every good thing  
            which is in you for Christ's sake.  
<sup>7</sup>For I have come to have much joy and comfort in your love,  
    because the hearts of the saints have been refreshed  
        through you,  
            brother.
